# My Conversion: Marie Rudden



## My conversion

After attending services at CAS for a few years, I decided that I had found a deeply caring and spiritual home. A year ago, I told Rabbi Emerita Barbara Cohen and our current Rabbi Jennifer Rudin that I wanted to convert to Reconstructionist Judaism.

My background is Catholic, and then Quaker; my husband Pete is Jewish. We had observed the Jewish holidays together with friends for years. We joined the Village Synagogue in New York City when our child, Adrienne, was 12 so that they could take Hebrew classes. Adrienne wanted to do this: they had always considered themselves to be Jewish, and I deeply wanted her to have a spiritual identity and community. When learning Hebrew was difficult for them, Pete, Adrienne and I met monthly with a dear friend who teaches Hebrew School on Manhattan's Upper West Side to read stories from the Tanakh together. Adrienne went to Israel through the Birthright program and had a Bat Mitzvah at the Wailing Wall. After an Affirmation Ceremony at Knesset Israel in Pittsfield, Adrienne joined that synagogue three years ago.

After we moved to the Berkshires in 2001, I joined a small Quaker Meeting in Lenox, but it closed after a few years due to deaths and moves by members, I continued to look for a spiritual home. Witnessing the funeral services of two dear friends led by Rabbi Barbara Cohen, I became intrigued. She obviously knew them well, and the services were beautiful. I met with Barbara afterwards and she suggested that I come to Services at CAS. Once I did, I found them to be moving and began reading more deeply about the foundations and practices of Judaism, and particularly Reconstructionist Judaism. I took two courses with Rabbi James Ponet at the Yale Alumni College, and two on American Jewish Literature and on memoirs written by European Jews from the 17<sup>th</sup> and 18<sup>th</sup> centuries. Then, a year ago, I told both Rabbi Cohen and Rabbi Rudin that I wanted to convert. Rabbi Rudin gave me a list of readings she suggested, and I met with her regularly. I wound up adding other readings and learned to read Hebrew through a book the Rabbi gave me, at least enough to decipher and then read certain prayers.

My conversion ceremony occurred on January 22 at the Mayyim Hayyim Mikvah in Newton MA, accompanied by my husband, two friends and Rabbi Rudin. My Beit Din discussions were extremely enjoyable, and the experience of the Mikvah, along with the beautiful prayers suggested, left me in somewhat of a trance. They were simply beautiful: "May the words of my mouth, the meditations of my heart, and this act of immersion seal my devotion to a life of Torah, a life of service, and a life made holy by acts of loving kindness. "After the third immersion I prayed, "Holy One of Blessing, You have made me a Jew."




A beautiful Shabbat evening service and celebration occurred the next day, when I was blessed again by Rabbi Rudin, who declared the Hebrew name that I have chosen, Miriam. Now my journey to find a spiritual home has both ended and begun.



A virtuosic multi-instrumental musician, singer, and composer, Joey Weisenberg has devoted himself to opening up the sounds of people singing together in community. The founder and director of Hadar's Rising Song Institute, which aims to cultivate the grassroots musical-spiritual creativity of the Jewish people, Joey works to educate and train communities worldwide to unlock their musical-spiritual potential and make music a vibrant, joy-filled force in Jewish life. Joey is the author of *Building Singing Communities*, a practical guide to bringing people together in song, as well as *The Torah of Music*, a treasury of Jewish teachings and insights about the spiritual nature of music, which received the National Jewish Book Award in 2017. A devoted student and teacher of ancient and traditional Jewish melodies, Joey composes new nigunim that have moved and inspired Jews worldwide. He has released eight albums of original music, most recently *L'eila*, available on Rising Song Records.

# Notes from the January Board Meetings

January 12, 2026

- Rabbi Rudin offered a message of concern and hope in the face of recent national and international events. She also noted our sadness about the death of the daughter of Rev. Carol Killian, minister of the United Church of Pittsfield, and a long-time friend and member of our congregation.
- Mr. Ed Wagner, a certified mold inspector from Easthampton, MA, elaborated on his recent written report to the Board. He said that the problem is rooted in the high moisture levels in the basement. Because of the dirt floor and stone foundation, long-term mitigation will require significant investments to properly seal and ventilate the space. He strongly encouraged us to gain the services of a mechanical engineer before taking any steps to address the situation. Based on Mr. Wagner's report, it was the consensus of the Board that we need to stay out of the building for the time being, and to identify possible locations for a temporary home for the congregation.
- Thanks were given to Susan Weinstein for helping out with the mail during Arthur Hillman's vacation, to John Slote for cleaning the Ark, and to the several members of the congregation who assisted with the examination of the Torahs.

## Special Meeting: January 26, 2026

- Joan Burkhard noted that inquiries at several possible alternative locations in South County showed them to be either unavailable or cost prohibitive. The one exception was the Unitarian Universalist Meeting of South Berkshire in Housatonic. A tour of the building by members of the Executive Committee and the Rabbi determined that it was indeed a viable option. The Board voted unanimously to open negotiations with the UUMSB to rent space through the end of 2026, and possibly longer.
- Responsibility for financial transactions and record keeping is being moved to the accountancy firm of Orenstein & Company, LLC and Sonia Orenstein Barile with whom the Board has recently contracted. This is a gradual process, however, and Arthur Hillman continues to take care of various day-to-day matters.
- The fourth meeting of the Hadar Caring Committee group is upcoming. Rabbi Rudin hopes to promote a sense of shared community within the congregation and strongly encourages members to let her know about significant events in their lives.
- A Tu B'Shevat service will be held at the Friends Meeting House in Great Barrington on Saturday, February 7<sup>th</sup> at 10 AM, location to be determined.
- Of the six Torahs owned by the congregation, three are damaged but repairable, and three are beyond repair. The Rabbi has identified someone who can examine the damaged Torahs and advise us on how to proceed and on possible expenses. Because Jewish tradition discourages use of damaged Torahs, Rabbi Rudin will bring a Torah of her own to services.
- Because many of our prayerbooks and Torah commentaries are damaged, the Board authorized the Religious and Spiritual Life Committee to pursue the purchase of approximately 20 and 15 books, respectively.


