#### Rabbi Barbara to retire

Congregation Ahavath Sholom is announcing that Rabbi Barbara Kipnis Cohen will be stepping away from the pulpit after 20 years as the spiritual leader of our 100-year-old congregation. Founded in 1923 and led by Rabbi Jacob Axelrod for the following 60 years, the congregation has remained in the historic building it occupies on North Street in Great Barrington for its entire history. It is the oldest synagogue building in continuous use in the Berkshires. An affiliate of Reconstructing Judaism, the congregation will be marking its second century in 2024 with a series of special events including educational and social offerings throughout the spring and summer, culminating in a celebration in September 2024 that will also honor Rabbi Cohen. As Rabbi Cohen has explained, "I have loved every minute as the spiritual leader of this community since July 1, 2005, and I and my family have felt loved, respected, and embraced in return. At this point in my life, and still in good health, I feel the inner call to begin a new chapter. My wish is to have time to focus on and to grow in my spirituality and to pursue my diverse interests . . . wherever that journey leads me. I am not leaving the Berkshires, so my wanderings will remain, as usual, in the inner landscape, and local."





Rabbi Cohen will continue her private practice of meeting with individuals as they explore their spiritual "wonderings" at her office in downtown Lenox. "I am not retiring in the classic sense of the word . . . just channeling my love of spiritually accompanying individuals of all ages in a new way. I have been a pulpit partner or solo clergy person for 30 years and the time feels right to explore different paths."

The CAS Board of Directors has met with the Ritual and Spiritual Life (RSL) committee to begin a comprehensive process of evaluating our goals and priorities as a community as we search for a new spiritual leader, while also acknowledging the wonderful twenty years working in partnership with our beloved Rabbi. A working group is being formed that will include Board members, members of the RSL, and members of the CAS community at large. Among the responsibilities of this group will be to engage with the entire congregation, explore options, lay out a timetable and set goals, and provide regular progress reports to our community, as we move forward into our second century.

# CAS/Jewish Museum Virtual Tour: Scenes from the Collection



## Upcoming February CAS/Jewish Museum Tour: Marta Minujín

On Sunday, February 25<sup>th</sup> at 4:00 PM on Zoom, Rena Tobey will offer the second of three online tours to be held this winter, *Marta Minujín: Arte! Arte!* The Minujín exhibition is currently at the Jewish Museum in New York City and will remain in place until March 31, 2024.

Marta Minujín: Arte! Arte! Arte! includes nearly 100 works organized to reflect Minujín's bold experimentation over six decades. The exhibition charts Minujín's influential career in Buenos Aires as well as time spent in Paris, New York, and Washington, DC, through a range of pioneering, mattress-based soft sculptures; fluorescent large-scale paintings; psychedelic drawings and performances; and vintage film footage. The artist's ephemeral works—happenings, participatory installations, and monumental public art—are presented through rarely seen photographs, video, and other documentation.

Born in 1943 in Buenos Aires, Argentina, to an immigrant family partly descended from Russian Jews, Minujín established an international reputation as a key artistic voice at a young age. By the early 1960s, she had started to experiment with mattresses, creating colorful soft sculptures that would come to define her signature style. Today Minujín is one of Argentina's most recognized artists and celebrated cultural personalities. She continues to produce multimedia installations, participatory Events, paintings, and sculptures, attesting to her unceasing versatility, well into the twenty-first century, Minujín's art persists with vital force, critical vision, and clarity of purpose.

# llene Spiewak painting and talk at D'Amour Museum of Fine Art

On Thursday, February 29<sup>th</sup> at noon, Ilene Spiewak, artist, art therapist, art educator, and CAS board member, will be giving a talk about her work.

How do we want to see ourselves in the 21st Century? The politics of identity and the presentation of identity to self is important to llene, whose work is included in *The Outwin 2022: American Portraiture Today* exhibition. Her studio practice raises tough questions about aesthetic norms and cultural values. Of her work, Spiewak writes "I am making myself and re-making myself: I do it again and again. I paint with a searching gaze. My gaze is considerate of the human condition and is not based on sameness.

I pay attention. Introspection is profound.

I am not invisible."



Launched in 2006 to support contemporary portraiture in the United States, the National Portrait Gallery's celebrated triennial Outwin Boochever Portrait Competition returns to the Springfield Museums. A major survey of the best American portraits, selected by internationally prominent jurors and curators, *The Outwin: American Portraiture Today* presents 42 works selected from over 2,700 entries, that foreground the vibrancy and relevance of portraiture today.


