Here are Ilene Spiewak's recommended cocktails to enjoy while viewing this event:

Bloody Mary Shelley

1.5 oz vodka

3 oz cranberry juice

Stir ingredients and pour into coupe glass

Garnish with black licorice nib on a cocktail pick

Bewitched Bourbon and Apple Cider

1 oz bourbon

4 oz apple cider

1/2 tsp maple syrup

Combine ingredients and shake

Pour into a rocks glass with ice

Garnish with apple wedge

Tall Tale

2 oz rye whiskey

1/4 oz maple syrup

1/2 oz lemon juice

Shake ingredients, pour into coupe glass and garnish with cinnamon stick

FrankenFizz

1.5 oz vodka

2 oz ginger beer

2 oz apple cider

Stir ingredients and pour into a highball glass with ice

Garnish with green apple wedge and sprinkle of ground cinnamon

Autumn Fizz

2 oz gin

1/4 lemon juice

Splash of apple cider

Shake ingredients, pour into coupe glass and garnish with pear or apple wedge

Mock the Raven

4 oz apple cider

2 oz ginger beer

1/2 oz maple syrup

Stir ingredients and pour into rocks glass with ice

Garnish with apple wedge and sprinkle of ground cinnamon


