Rabbi Barbara reminded us to consider the central themes of Pesach...freedom, redemption, and the willingness and courage to leave the familiar for a potentially improved but undefined life. She also posed the question: "what are the plagues in our lives that keep us stuck and unable to make decisions that could help us go forward? We are sometimes our own Pharaoh!" A central table in the sanctuary contained the seder plate, matzohs, wine, a variety of charoset dishes and some light desserts. After our service and discussion, each of us returned to our homes for a Passover dinner.










#### I, Teresa de Lucena: How We Built the Book

On Sunday, April 28, at the Quaker Meeting House in Great Barrington, author Ellen Kanner, illustrator Annie Zeybekoglu, and Rabbi Barbara Cohen discussed <u>I Teresa de Lucena</u>: Reflections on the Trial of a Conversa. Using visual examples from the book, Ellen spoke of the history and lengthy development of the project and the interplay between text, interpretation, and design in completing the book, Rabbi Barbara spoke about the interplay between the creative process and Jewish tradition in the production of the text. Annie discussed the creation and design of the book pages and also brought a number of her artist's books to the event. Light refreshments were served afterwards.

I. Teresa de Lucena: Reflections on the Trial of a Conversa is the result of a unique collaboration between a translator, an artist, and a rabbi who joined forces and their respective talents to tell the story of Teresa de Lucena (1467-1545), a woman who faced the Spanish Inquisition twice. It is a work of microhistory, a nonfiction genre that places an individual at the center of the narrative and then zooms out to create the larger context of her life and times. Where did she live? How old was she when her father fled from Spain? Who were the witnesses against her? The book, based on Kanner's translations of the original Inquisition transcripts, Zeybekoglu's evocative illustrations, and Rabbi Cohen's insights into Jewish culture, creates an intimate portrait of a conversa in tumultuous times.

## Study Session with Rabbi Jennifer Rudin

On Saturday, April 13th we welcomed Rabbi Jennifer for a study session; on the 20th we held the third of her three scheduled visits as she led the congregation in a Shabbat morning service.

## A Reminder about an Opportunity to Explore your Family Roots

#### Sit with an experienced genealogist and learn more about your family history.

CAS member Keren Weiner, a genealogist with twenty years of experience, will work with you, in real time, to find documents that could uncover country of origin, date of immigration, dates of marriage and birth, siblings, occupations, and other clues to your roots. With you as co-pilot, she will guide you to the sources where you are most likely to find results and teach you how to use these sources yourself. Using various databases to solve mysteries, she will break through brick walls, or simply give you a start as you walk in the footsteps of your ancestors, and she will save the records to a thumb drive you can take home, save, print, and share with family.

Some of our members who have worked with Keren have reported wonderful surprises: one member discovered that her second great grandfather had been a saloon keeper! Another, calling Keren's work "meticulous," offered that Keren's research had led her to reframe what she thought she knew about her mother's family, in particular, her grandmother. Each one who worked with Keren had a rich and meaningful experience.

"Sitting together, we located documents I had never seen before. This renewed interest in the family history stimulated memories and sharing, and gave me the idea to look further – for myself and generations to come."

Another appreciated her organized process and added: "Even though we began our meeting having already gathered quite a bit of information from Ancestry.com and family sources, Keren was able to open new avenues of inquiry that helped deepen and expand our family knowledge."

#### And yet another congregant shares:

"I have some experience doing searches on sites like Ancestry.com, but Keren's ability to navigate genealogical resources was clearly light years ahead of mine. She easily overcame obstacles that would have presented me with dead ends.... In a little over an hour she discovered the names of a set of great-great grandparents, where they came from, the ships that brought them to the United States in the 1870s, and the street where they lived after their arrival, all things previously unknown to me. She was also able to refine a legend that the family was in the tobacco business--in fact, they were cigarette makers. In addition to this information, Keren offered several suggestions for possible future research. In all, this was a highly productive session that far exceeded my expectations."


