Notes from the November Board Meeting

- Board members described Rabbi Rudin's Installation on Oct. 31st and Nov. 1st as "moving, perfect, inspiring," and overall, a great success. Around 60 people attended both the Friday evening and Saturday morning events in the synagogue. (About ten more could have been accommodated.) The only suggestion was that the tent could have used an additional heater, as the corners were cold.
- The highly invasive Japanese Knotweed behind the synagogue has been sprayed, and will be cut down and removed. A re-treatment will be required next June. Another large tree in the back needs to be taken down, but the birch tree can be saved by cabling.
- Initial efforts are being made to address mold issues in the synagogue, as there is concern about both the health effects on congregants, and on the condition of the Torahs.
- Rabbi Rudin will be attending this year's Reconstructing Judaism Convention in Philadelphia. She encourages other congregants to join her.
- There will be a Hanukkah party at the synagogue on Saturday, December 20th at 5:00 p.m. Items left over from last year's Hanukkah pop-up will be arranged in baskets by Susan Weinstein and raffled off at the party.
- Current finances are considered satisfactory at the moment, but the congregation still needs to address a
 continuing deficit. An end-of-the-year donation appeal will be made in early December. The Board also discussed
 the possibility of setting up a schedule of continuing donations through the year at different dollar amount levels.
